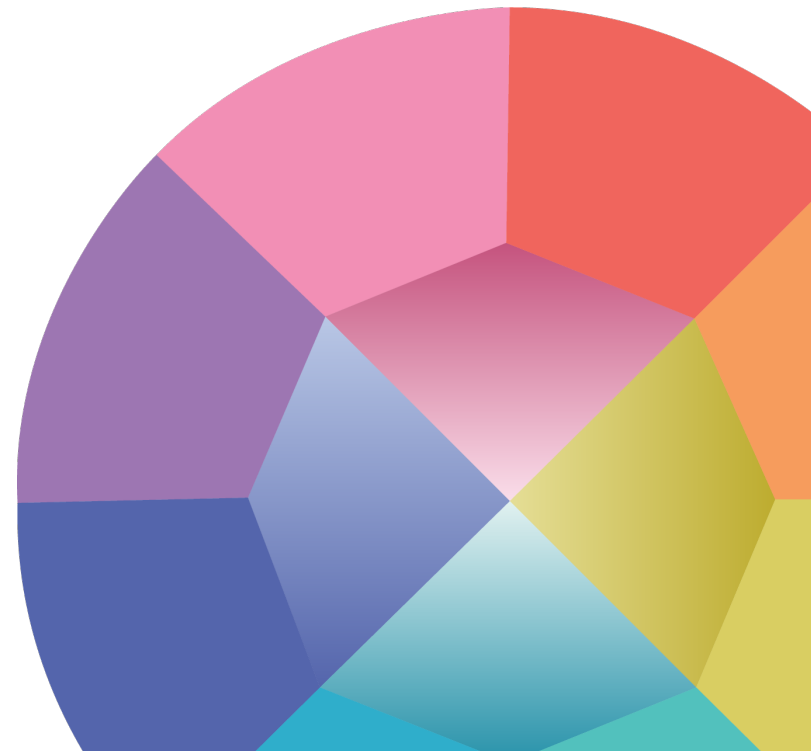

DrEAM, what is it?

An **international mobility support program** designed for PhD students as part of the Lorraine Université d'Excellence (LUE) Initiative



→ To allow PhD students to have an international research experience during their PhD

→ To boost the development of our international collaborations and visibility

DrEAM, what is it?



1. Funding of **up to €1,500** for a round trip to the host structure abroad

+

2. **A travel allowance package* of up to €5,000** which will cover part of the living expenses in the host country (meals, accommodation, public transport, visa...)

*The travel allowance package will be calculated on the basis of the per diem rate in force in the host country and will amount to **20% of this rate**.

=

An attractive financial support which can total up to €6,500

Who can apply?

- **PhD students enrolled at UL** (not in a derogatory year)
- **Length of stay:** 2 to 6 months (possibility to split your stay)
- In an **academic research structure** where you have never studied before
- Within the framework of a structured **research partnership** (existence of an international agreement, IRN, LEA/LIA, Labex, PHC...) or **one in the process of being structured**



Who can apply?

- In the case of a **cotutelle**, the mobility must take place in a country different from the countries involved in the cotutelle
- **Favourable opinions** from your thesis supervisor, head of research unit, head of doctoral school and employer if different from UL



Selection



by a *dedicated Commission*
which assesses:

- **Quality of the mobility project** (contribution to the PhD student's research subject and professional training at large) according to an evaluation grid
- **Quality of the existing or future partnership opportunities** with the host structure



How and when to apply?

3 calls for applications (called **episodes**) launched a year



- **Complete application form** with requested signatures including a **provisional schedule** of the research activities and tasks planned during the stay
- **Detailed CV** of 2 pages including publications and posters
- **Letter of acceptance** from the host institution stating the dates of the stay
- **Quotations** for travel and accommodation expenses
